Students receive enrolment packs for each programme of study.

MID-OCTOBER

The University advises on the success of applications for placement in a Massey University Hall of Residence, residential complex, unit or apartment.

If you are successful, you need to confirm your place by the date given on your offer.

Closing date for accommodation applications for International Students.

31 JANUARY

Final day for students to confirm their accommodation. (Students who change their mind and advise the University on or before this date will receive a partial refund of their deposit.)

Campus and college pre-semester activities, including: Orientation, reporting-in-person and welcome sessions.

28 FEBRUARY

Semester One and Double Semester begins.

Types of Accommodation

We know that after choosing what subjects you'll study at Massey University, your next most important choice is where you'll live.

You have a range of accommodation options at each of our three campuses, including Halls of Residence, residential complexes, apartments, units, and homestays. These are managed either by Massey University or an agent of Massey. You may also decide to stay in private accommodation.

Our experienced accommodation staff can help you to choose the type of accommodation that's right for you, as well as give you all the advice you'll need to make that decision.

Here's an overview of our accommodation options:

» MASSEY HALLS OF RESIDENCE

- > You live in your own room within a hall. Halls usually house up to 100 students.
- > They are managed by residential accommodation staff, who establish guidelines for living, monitor the community environments, offer support and arrange activities.
- > Usually located close to, or on, campus.
- > Halls may or may not provide meals for residents.
- > You don't need to worry about paying lots of different bills or, in some halls, cooking meals.
- > Excellent facilities including computer rooms.
- > Single-sex and co-ed options.
- > A great place to meet people and make friends.
- > It's a close-knit environment with people your own age.

» APARTMENTS OR UNITS MANAGED BY MASSEY

- > You have your own rooms in a managed apartment or unit.
- > They are managed by residential accommodation staff who establish guidelines for living and offer support to residents.
- > In most apartments and units you'll need to organise your own meals and pay bills.
- > A good mix – you get the independence of a unit plus support from residential accommodation staff.
- > A smaller and more intimate living environment with people your own age.

» RESIDENTIAL COMPLEXES

- > You live in your own room within a complex.
- > Complexes vary in size, but usually house between 100 and 300 students.
- > Complexes may or may not provide meals for residents.
- > There are single-sex and co-ed options.
- > The complexes are usually close to campus.
- > You are with a larger community of people your own age.

» HOMESTAY

Homestay accommodation is available to any student studying at Massey University. All international students under 18 years of age must live in Massey approved homestay accommodation.

- > Homestay students have their own room in a family home. Some families have more than one student staying with them.
- > Homestays give international students a chance to directly experience New Zealand life, culture and language.
- > Massey Homestay Advisers can help students find a family with similar interests.
- > Homestay accommodation is offered in most areas of the campus cities.

» PRIVATE FLATS

After their first year, many students choose to move into private flats with other people.

- > Private flats provide independence for students, but there is a lot more to organise than with other accommodation options.
- > You and your flatmates are responsible for your own grocery shopping, meals, rental agreements and payments, bill payments, budgets and relationships within the flat.
- > While Massey does not take responsibility for problems you may have with private accommodation, our Accommodation Advisers will give you advice and support as required.
- > Most flats in New Zealand are rented out unfurnished. If you move into a flat with flatmates, you may have to purchase furniture for the flat and your own bedroom.

Massey's Campuses

Massey University is one of New Zealand's largest universities. It has modern campuses: Albany, located on Auckland's North Shore; Manawatu, based in Palmerston North; and Wellington, based in the heart of the capital city. This gives you the freedom to choose how and where you want to study.

MASSEY UNIVERSITY'S INNOVATIVE ALBANY CAMPUS IS LOCATED ON THE NORTH SHORE OF NEW ZEALAND'S LARGEST CITY – AUCKLAND.

Home to around 1.4 million people, Auckland is a fast-paced international city. 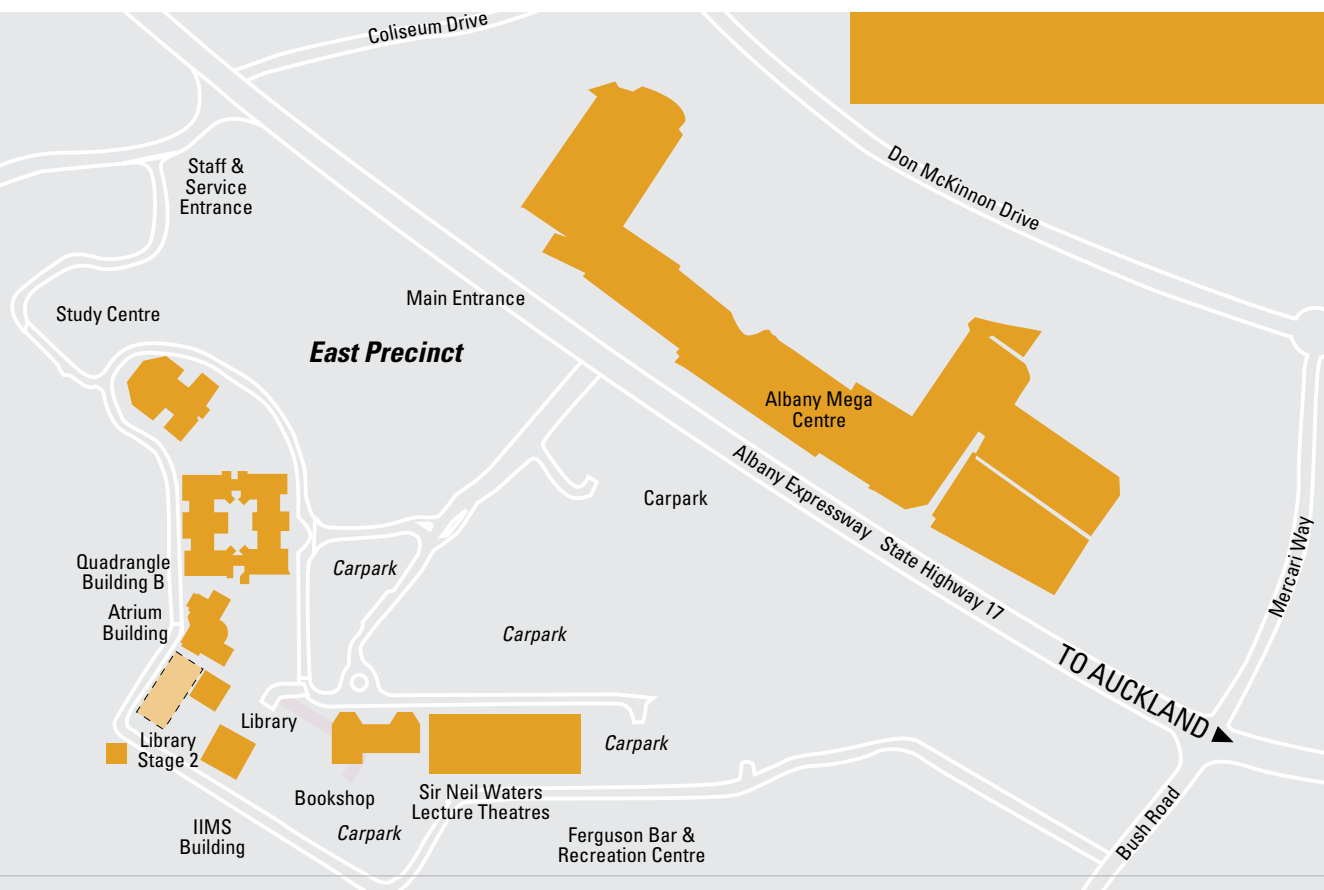
The campus has top-quality facilities including a five-storey library, modern lecture theatre blocks and study rooms, a large fully-equipped recreation centre, several cafeterias, a student common room and a popular student bar. If you have a car, there's a large student carpark right in front of the campus.

Massey University staff and the Albany Students' Association work together to provide entertainment and social events throughout the year. Groups of students meet up for all sorts of reasons – sporting and cultural events, day and weekend trips, and socialising at the student bar.

On the learning side, the campus has some nationally-recognised areas of focus, including information systems, design and engineering, applied social sciences and financial analysis. The strength of Massey Albany's postgraduate and research programmes is underpinned by its role as the home of both the New Zealand Institute for Advanced Study, where world-renowned scientists collaborate on original thinking that produces advancement in knowledge and The Allan Wilson Centre for Molecular Ecology and Evolution, a government-designated Centre of Research Excellence. The campus is also home to the business incubator e-centre.

All student accommodation buildings at Albany are owned by Buildcorp Management Limited (BML), and they are jointly managed by BML and Massey University. The Massey University Albany Accommodation Co-ordinator monitors all student accommodation.

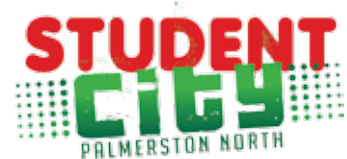

Manawatu Campus

LIVE AND LEARN IN NEW ZEALAND'S 'STUDENT CITY'

The Manawatu campus is one of the best places in the country to enjoy a student lifestyle. The campus has two locations, Turitea – renowned for its beautiful park-like setting of trees and gardens, and Hokowhitu – on the city-side of the Manawatu River, near the lagoon. Turitea has undergone an extensive facelift in recent years, and is now a hub of student activity with a student centre, food hall and shops.

The campus focuses on providing a community where students are supported while they study. Massey Manawatu offers a wide range of on-campus halls and units, catering for over 900 students of diverse ages, programmes of study and cultural backgrounds.

Each Hall of Residence or unit has a live-in Residential Adviser. This adviser provides help and guidance if you need it. They also help to arrange activities for the halls. Living on campus also means that you have easy access to a range of facilities such as the gymnasium, cafeterias, the library and computer labs. The Library Information Commons is also a popular place to meet people, have a coffee and do some study.

Alliance Catering Food Services is a quality food provider for the campus and the food court serves a wide variety of meals throughout the day. There is flexibility on when these meals are taken, so ask about the "meal swaps" that let you collect your dinner at lunch time.

Residents of halls and units are well known for their inter-hall competing and socialising. There are a number of competitions throughout the year, including a crazy sports day, beach volleyball tournament, and a touch rugby tournament. Social events include barbecues, an Easter Egg Hunt and the Residents' Ball.

There are excellent on-campus sports facilities including the best gym in town, the Sport and Rugby Institute, an equestrian centre (yes, you can bring your horse!) and a community athletics track. It's a unique community where you can live in top accommodation and have a great social and study life.



There are four communities at Turitea in Palmerston North – Atawhai, Moginie, The Courts and Turitea.

ATAWHAI >> is located on a ridge above Turitea, quite near the College of Business. This community largely caters to mature students and family groups.

MOGINIE >> is on a small rise quite near the Vet tower and has stunning views of the city. Moginie caters largely for the school leaver age group in both halls and mature students in units.

THE COURTS >> are located right next to the gym and sports field and is home to a mix of New Zealand and international self-catering students.

TURITEA HALLS >> are in the heart of the campus, right next to lecture theatres and the bus stop. Turitea caters largely for the school leaver age group.

Atawhai

MANAWATU



Located on a sunny ridge above the Turitea site, the Atawhai units are only a 15-minute walk through beautiful bush to the main campus. Atawhai is a peaceful residential area, with a supportive village-like atmosphere. Each unit is shared by five residents, and there are also family units available.

These units are available for mature students, mainly those studying at postgraduate level. Each unit is completely self-contained, but there are many opportunities for the community to socialise together using the Atawhai commons. There is a playground for children, which is approximately a 5-minute walk away.

Atawhai has its own small computer lab, and is only a short walk from the extensive on-campus computing resources.



ATAWHAI FAMILY UNITS SERVICES AND FACILITIES

- » **COMMUNITY** Caters for families, mostly postgraduate students, both international and domestic.

- » **TECHNOLOGY SERVICES** Atawhai Family Units are a 10-minute walk from the undergraduate and postgraduate computer labs on campus. The Atawhai Common Room also has a computer lab. Telephone in each unit (connections to a service provider at residents' expense). A broadband internet service is available at a cost to the resident.*
- » **SUPPORT** A Residential Adviser is housed at Atawhai. The Halls Community Group oversees community wellbeing and social activities. Atawhai is close to free on-campus student services including Medical Centre, Student Counselling and Student Learning Development Centre.
- » **SECURITY** All external doors are lockable. 24-hour security staff patrol campus and are available for assistance.
- » **MEALS** Atawhai Family Units are self-catered, and residents have facilities to cook their own meals. Alternatively, individual residents can elect to purchase a meal plan, with a meal package incorporated in the accommodation fees. The units are a 10-minute walk from the central food court.
- » **TRANSPORT** 10-minute walk to central bus stop on campus, regular free bus service to the city and between Turitea and Hokowhitu sites. Additional free bus service to and from the city on Thursday and Saturday nights, from the main bus stop.

Moginie

MANAWATU



Situated on Munro Hill, Moginie has a fabulous view over the entire city. On a clear day, you can see Mounts Taranaki and Ruapehu. Moginie is a place to get away from it all and still be only 5 minutes from campus via an underpass. The community is well-equipped with its own computer lab and laundry blocks, as well as facilities in each hall.

Bindaloe and Craiglockhart are our two best kept secrets. Both gracious old buildings, Bindaloe - a villa, and Craiglockhart - one of the original homesteads, have been converted to single-sex halls, though they operate as one. Each hall has large verandahs, so there is plenty of opportunity to take in the views and soak up the sun.

Framed by a row of Palmerston North's iconic Phoenix palms, Moginie Hall has a dignified lawn setting that borders onto the wide open spaces of Massey's farmlands.

More Accommodation Options

HOMESTAY

Homestay accommodation is when a student lives with a local family in the family's home. Homestay is popular with international students because it gives them the opportunity to practise English and learn about New Zealand culture in a safe and supportive environment. All international students under 18 years must stay in a homestay. Homestay is also a good option for New Zealand students who would benefit from living in a family environment.

Massey University feels strongly about providing its students with quality accommodation options. We visit each prospective homestay host and carry out a police check on them before they can become approved hosts. Each Massey University homestay student must be provided with 24-hour access to his or her own clean, tidy and warm room which has:

- > a bed and linen (laundered weekly)
- > a heater
- > desk, chair and reading lamp
- > pillows, blankets and towels

- > at least one set of drawers and a wardrobe
- > power points.

Each homestay student has access to a kitchen, a telephone, bathroom, toilet, laundry facilities, living and dining rooms. You will be provided with meals by your homestay hosts.

Homestay students pay weekly board to their homestay hosts. Albany and Wellington students pay \$230 per week. Manawatu students pay \$210 per week.

You must apply for homestay accommodation. When you submit your application you will need to pay a NZ\$350 bond which is refundable, and a non-refundable \$200 homestay administration fee, which covers the initial homestay placement and one move within the first 14 days.

Massey University is committed to providing a safe and happy homestay environment for students. Dedicated Homestay Accommodation Advisers are always available to help and give advice to students and their families.

PRIVATE ACCOMMODATION

Private accommodation can include hostels, apartments, flats or boarding. Although the University is not responsible for private accommodation, accommodation staff do give advice and support to students who live in private accommodation. Accommodation Advisers can also help you in your quest for accommodation, so make sure you drop in before you start looking.

Your Accommodation Adviser will be able to give you lots of options near your campus.

How to find private accommodation at Massey

There are a number of ways to find private accommodation at Massey, and here are a few of them. Flats and apartments are advertised:

- > weekly on Massey's Students' Associations' notice boards
- > on other notice boards around the University
- > on student radio stations (listings played once or twice a day)
- > in the 'To Let' section of local newspapers (Wednesdays and Saturdays)
- > with private rental agencies (this comes at a cost)

- > on accommodation websites such as www.flatfinder.co.nz and www.flathunt.co.nz

Ask your Massey Accommodation Adviser for advice and listings.

PRIVATE FLATTING

After their first year of study, many students move into rented flats. Sometimes it can be quite a change from living in a Hall of Residence or managed apartment, and there are some important things to consider before you take the plunge.

Cost

- > Can you afford to pay the rent?
- > How much is the bond, and how much do you have to pay in advance?
- > How much will food and bills cost you?
- > Is the flat furnished or will you have to buy furniture?

- > Are there hidden costs: connection fees for utilities (power, gas and phone), moving costs, letting agency fees (if you use one), heating costs and groceries? Make a list.

Size

- > Is the room big enough and light enough to study?
- > Is there room for your car or bike to be off the road?

Flatmates

- > Do they have similar ideas about housekeeping?
- > Have you discussed household chores, cooking requirements and how you'll pay the bills?
- > Who will put the utilities in their name?

Distance

- > Is it within walking/biking/driving distance of Massey or on the free bus route (Manawatu) or other public transport (Albany, Wellington)?

Security

- > Will your belongings be secure?

The lease

- > Have you read and understood the lease?
- > Are you happy with the duration of the lease?
- > Is everyone in the flat paying a bond and signing the lease?

We recommend that you look at a selection of flats before choosing one. When it comes to the lease, make sure you read the document and that you and your flatmates are aware of your responsibilities before you sign it. If there's anything you don't understand, call your local Accommodation Adviser or contact the nearest branch of Tenancy Services.

If you have problems during the year, either with your flatmates or landlord, you can get help from the Accommodation Office, or the Students' Association at your campus.

Sometimes there may be a good reason why you cannot live in the halls. Local students may choose to stay at home, and sometimes we have a shortage of places in the halls. But that doesn't mean you can't participate in activities. Contact the Accommodation Adviser to see how you can get involved in campus life.

» ACCOMMODATION

There are a variety of accommodation options for Massey University students. Each campus has its own Accommodation Office, where students can get advice and support on all aspects of accommodation.

» CAREER INFORMATION AND GRADUATE RECRUITMENT SERVICES

There are career information and recruitment offices on each of Massey's campuses. These career services provide a link between Massey University and a wide range of employers, helping them fill both full-time graduate positions and short-term summer jobs and internships. They also provide valuable career planning advice.

» CHAPLAINCY

There are a wide variety of faith and spirituality groups on Massey campuses, to serve the needs of students and staff. Christian groups for prayer and Bible study operate on all campuses. Muslim groups are active at Albany and Manawatu. On the Albany, Manawatu and Wellington campuses, Chaplains from a variety of Christian churches and a range of ethnicities are available to talk individually with people about personal matters or any other concerns related to life at the University. Find out more about these services at each campus through Student Services or on the web.

» CHILDCARE

Massey University offers a variety of childcare facilities and services at the Albany and Manawatu campuses. As they are very popular pre-booking is essential. Further information can be found at <http://childcare.massey.ac.nz>

» TE URU KARAKA KŌHANGA REO

Our Kōhanga Reo at Turitea on the Manawatu campus provides pre-school education in a total immersion Māori language environment for children of staff and students.

» CLUBS AND SOCIETIES

There's a club to suit everyone at Massey, with a huge range of sporting, activity, political and cultural clubs to choose from. While at Massey, make the most of the clubs – it's a great way to meet new people, get involved and broaden your horizons and social network.

» COMPUTING

Massey University's Information Technology Services provides students with a range of computer facilities across all campuses, and over the internet. All students are assigned a Massey student usercode and an email address. This can be used to access online services such as course and campus information, email and enrolment online. Students can also access their email and the internet from computer labs and halls' mini-labs, some of which provide 24-hour access.

» DISABILITY SERVICES

Massey University has specialist staff available to assist students with disabilities. These services are available for on-campus and extramural students and are designed to make the tertiary learning environment more accessible, comfortable and hassle-free.

» CENTRES FOR UNIVERSITY PREPARATION AND ENGLISH LANGUAGE STUDIES (CUPELS)

Massey University Centres for University Preparation and English Language Studies (CUPELS) offer a range of English language and university preparation programmes for domestic and international students with different levels of English language proficiency and goals. The programmes offered at all three campuses include the: Direct Entry English Pathway, Certificate of University Preparation, Certificate in Foundation Studies and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL). Call 0800 MASSEY to contact your closest CUPELS support staff.

» MEDICAL

There are medical centres on each of Massey University's campuses. The centres have a range of professionals, including counsellors, nurses, doctors, physiotherapists and nutritionists. Contact your campus services for details.

» INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The International Student Support Office (ISSO) at each campus provides comprehensive advice and welfare services to all international students, and is also a resource centre for students and their families. ISS staff can assist you to work through any difficulties you may experience while studying in New Zealand.

» LEARNING SUPPORT

Student Learning Development Services is an academic learning support service that helps students to be successful in their university study. It helps with essay and exam preparation and study techniques, gives advice on preparing written and oral presentations



and helps students to get the best out of lectures and tutorials. In February of each year, short study skills courses are offered for first-year students.

» LIBRARY SERVICES

Massey University's libraries contain over a million books, and that's not counting the thousands of print and electronic journals. All students, including those studying extramurally, have access to books and journals from all campuses, whether they visit in person or via the library's website <http://library.massey.ac.nz>. Subject guides on the website are a great way to discover the range of print and electronic resources available.

» MĀORI STUDENTS

» SPORT AND RECREATION SERVICES

Recreation centres at each of Massey's campuses provide all students with a wide variety of recreation, fitness, and arts and crafts programmes. <http://recreation.massey.ac.nz>

» STUDENTS' ASSOCIATIONS

There are four main students' associations at Massey University, one for each campus: ASA – Albany Students' Association, MUSA – Massey University Students' Association at Manawatu campus, MAWSA – Massey Wellington Students' Association and EXMSS for Extramural students.

Massey University students' associations aim to make student life as exciting and vibrant as possible. They also work to ensure that student academic and welfare concerns are recognised and dealt with properly.

» STUDENT COUNSELLING

A counselling service operates on all campuses to assist students who may be experiencing personal and emotional problems, study difficulties or family concerns. Staffed by professional counsellors, psychologists and psychotherapists, the services offer individual and confidential support, workshops and support free-of-charge, to all students.

Welcome Programmes

Each Massey campus offers welcome programmes to new students and their families.

These programmes are designed to help students with their transition to university life, and to give their families an opportunity to see the campus for themselves.

There are a number of different welcome programmes, such as the *Let's Get Going* programme (a course for new students) and the Parents' Programme (an introduction for parents and families).

Students and their caregivers find the programmes useful. They can meet new people, share information with others and ask questions of Massey staff.

For more information on welcome programmes, please contact the Accommodation Adviser in your area. These programmes are very highly recommended as a way to settle into university and make new friends.

» GENERAL INFORMATION

Massey University is serious about the security of its students. All students at Massey University accommodation have rooms that can be locked, and most have a range of other security measures such as on-site security staff, alarms and electronic gates.

We also have accommodation suitable for students with disabilities at most campuses. Please contact your local Accommodation Adviser for more information.

International students must be 18-years or older if they wish to live in a Massey Hall of Residence. Massey University believes that a homestay is the most appropriate accommodation for international students under the age of 18-years.

» OPEN DAYS

We have Open Days at each campus as well as the welcome programmes for students and their friends and families. These events give students a real understanding of how the University works and what each campus has to offer, so it's a good idea to make the most of it. How to Apply for Accommodation

You can apply for accommodation online at <http://accommodation.massey.ac.nz>. You must complete the application forms to be considered for campus accommodation.





There are three forms included in the middle section of this guide.

- Accommodation Application Form (or you can apply online <http://accommodation.massey.ac.nz>.)
- Confidential Reference Form (required for New Zealand students).
- Homestay Accommodation Booking Form

Contact the accommodation offices at your campus to find out more about your accommodation options. Give yourself plenty of time to fill in the forms and get them back to the appropriate accommodation office. Applications for Halls of Residence, apartment complexes and student units are due by 1 October 2010 or for International students 16 January 2011.

Applications for homestay can be sent in at any time, but must be received at least two weeks prior to arrival. To find out more about homestay accommodation, contact the Centre for University Preparation and English Language Studies (CUPELS) - contact details are on the back cover.

» NEW ZEALAND STUDENTS

Applications are due by 1 October 2010 for the 2011 year. Late applications will be considered if there are vacancies. Your school provides a confidential reference that will be considered with your application, so it's important to make sure you give your reference form to your Principal, Dean or Careers Adviser with plenty of time to spare. (The reference form is found in the middle of this guide or you can apply online <http://accommodation.massey.ac.nz>.)

Referee requirements are a bit different if it's been a while since you left school or if you've been living overseas. It's a good idea to get in touch with an Accommodation Adviser to talk about appropriate referees.

Once you've sent in your application, Massey will get in touch with you by mid-October to either:

- > confirm they have a place available, and/or
- > request a deposit, or
- > tell you that you have been placed on a waiting list as there are no available places, or
- > tell you that your application has been declined.

If your application has been declined, you'll need to start looking at other options, which you'll see on page 32 of this guide.

Once you have sent in your application form, paid your deposit and we have received and approved your common confidential reference form, you will be offered a room.

» INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

You must apply if you would like accommodation on campus. Applications are due by 16 January 2011, but please submit your application when you receive your Offer of Place from Massey. International students are guaranteed accommodation upon arrival in New Zealand. There are, however, limited places available on campus, and priority is given to new students for Halls of Residence and on-campus units.

Accommodation information, including an application form, is sent when an Offer of Place is issued. If you intend to study at Massey University, you need to accept the Offer of Place, pay your tuition fees and apply for accommodation. Once tuition fees have been paid, a Confirmation of Place is issued and this document is then presented to the New Zealand Immigration Service with an application for a Student Visa.

The University's undertaking to assist with accommodation is stated in the Confirmation of Place letter.

When you send in your accommodation form, you will be contacted and advised of the result of your application. Massey will either:

- > confirm they have a place available, or
- > request a deposit, or
- > tell you that you have been placed on a waiting list as there are no available places, or
- > tell you that your application has been declined.

If your application has been declined, you'll need to start looking at other options, which you'll see on page 32 of this guide.

If you accept the accommodation offer, you need to pay the deposit immediately to secure your booking. It is important to note that an accommodation agreement is only confirmed when you have signed the accommodation agreement and paid the deposit.

International students under the age of 18 years must stay in homestay accommodation whilst they are studying in New Zealand. See page 31 for information about homestay accommodation.

We ask that if you think you will have difficulty adjusting to New Zealand food, you are to seek accommodation in self-catered halls or units. Once you have committed to fully-catered contracts, it is difficult to change.

Applications are accepted throughout the year, but the closing date for accommodation for international students is 16 January 2011.

Once your Offer of Place is confirmed, please send your accommodation application in for processing.

Qualifying as an international student

Students who do not hold New Zealand citizenship or permanent residency status are classified as international students. To gain entry into Massey University, international students need to complete an International Admission Application, which is available from the International Office, or from the website at <http://international.massey.ac.nz>

University accommodation is managed and regularly assessed by Massey University.

» CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

The criteria for selection are based on:

- > likelihood of academic success
- > likely contribution to the university community.

» DEPOSITS

All students applying for accommodation need to send in a deposit to secure their place. Accommodation offices on the different campuses may have slightly different processes. For more information on deposit amounts and dates please contact the relevant accommodation office.

For homestay at all campuses, students must pay NZ\$550 (a \$350 refundable bond and a \$200 non-refundable homestay administration fee).

» CANCELLATIONS

In the case of cancellations, students need to advise the relevant accommodation office in writing by 31 January 2011. After this date, the accommodation office or agent is under no obligation to return your deposit and will not usually do so unless they are able to re-let your room to another student.
